The Whites

TINY BUBBLES

Champagne needs very little introduction. Traditionally served as an aperitif or to celebrate occasions it is increasingly seen as a versatile wine to accompany the whole meal. Produced from the under ripe fruit of Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier and Chardonnay it is transformed into its final glorious state by a secondary fermentation in bottle followed by extended aging ‘on lees’ in the bottle.

Sparkling

Quality sparkling wine generally follows the principles of Champagne production, occasionally cutting a few corners, and is now produced in all corners of the globe. Rarely can they replicate the subtlety and complexity of their idol but they generally offer more fruitiness and instant satisfaction at a significant discount. Also suited to a wide range of dishes their obvious fruit characters make them good accompaniments to fruit based desserts.

Sauvignon Blanc

Sauvignon Blanc’s current popularity is no revelation. Depending on its region, it produces a style that is easily recognizable by all wine drinkers making it a safe bet. ‘New World’ countries tend to emphasize the variety’s propensity to make pungent fruit driven wines while France’s Loire Valley produces wines where fruit plays second fiddle to flinty mineral and herbal notes. The variety’s pungent character renders it less food friendly but looks to match similar flavors and you have some great pairings such as asparagus, goats cheese, cooked vegetables and fresh crunchy salads.

Chardonnay

The undisputed Queen of the white grape varieties. Well-traveled and very versatile it produces some of the world’s greatest wines in France’s Burgundy region. A winemaker’s delight because it can be subtly manipulated into so many different shapes. Oak adds fragrant wood spice, yeast lees stirring gives dairy and creaminess, malolactic fermentation can add broader buttery/butterscotch notes while the grape itself ranges through citrus, stone fruit and into tropical tones. Chablis offer’s Chardonnay’s most restrained mineral edged expression, while Burgundy has subtlety, complexity and power. The ‘New World’ can’t hide its more obvious range of fruit characters and winemaking notes. You will be surprised what Chardonnay pairs with Rich poultry dishes, fried foods and even oysters at the Chablis spectrum, steer away from strong spice though.

Riesling

Perhaps the most underrated international grape variety of all. Capable of producing both bone dry and lusciously sweet wines that give pleasure when young but can age for decades. From Germany’s Mosel Valley, the variety’s spiritual homeland, expect a juicy mix of gentle sweetness, zesty acidity and fresh citrus and pear fruit. France’s Alsace region produces richly textured examples displaying ripe stone fruit and mineral acidity. Australia’s classic regions – the Clare and Eden Valleys – usually offer bone dry examples with pure citrus drive. Riesling matches a huge variety of foods and is ideally suited to the spices of Balinese and Indonesian cuisine.

Pinot Grigio / Pinot Gris

You'll likely find primary fruit flavors of lime, lemon, pear, white nectarine, and apple. Each Pinot Grigio ranges between faint honeyed notes, floral aromas like honeysuckle, and a saline-like minerality. As a delicate, neutral wine, pinot grigio pairs best with light, fresh flavours. Think summery dishes like salads, chicken and seafood, as well as light pasta dishes and risottos, and avoid heavy sauces in favour of creams and vinaigrettes.

The Reds

Pinot Noir

Ahhhh.....Pinot Noir! The grape variety for the sensualist. Often light in color and body but looks are deceptive as its rich texture and ethereal flavours can captivate like no other variety. It is best from Burgundy where the wines are often tightly coiled in youth with tart berry fruits and unravel slowly with age to show earth, game and truffle. New Zealand is the vogue country for Pinot at the moment producing bright concentrated styles often quite plummy and spicy. Many obsessed ‘New World’ winemakers try their best to copy the French masterpieces and can produce excellent replicas albeit with slightly courser brush strokes. Pinot Noir’s low tannin level makes it a red wine well suited to seafood or lightly chilling yet its complexity and texture allow it to match with game, especially duck, hearty meat dishes and spice.

Merlot

Merlot is synonymous with soft, medium bodied plummy reds around the world but it is interesting to know in its French home, the Bordeaux region, the Merlot dominant wines of Pomerol and Saint Emilion have a compact powdery tannic structure allowing them to age gracefully much like their Cabernet based brothers. At the lower end of the scale expect smooth, plummy reds which seduce with softness and drink well alone or with pasta through to red meat. At the top end, especially in Bordeaux or cool climates you should see aromatic/floral medium bodied wines with drying tannins that love veal and beef matches.

Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Blend

Considered to be the aristocrat of grape varieties its personality mimics that of its heavily Anglicised trade in Bordeaux. Just imagine a grape variety that wears a cravat. It is grown all around the globe and has been for centuries in some cases, and is possibly the most recognized premium grape variety in the world. It should be aromatic and complex on the nose with notes of black fruits, cassis, plums, wood spice, dried leaf, cigar box, cedar and leather while the palate should be medium bodied, fresh and well structured with fine drying tannins and flavors that mimic the nose. The great wines of Bordeaux tend to be lighter in body, more aromatic and dryer and are capable of aging for over a century, while those of other countries usually offer fuller softer versions. It is the perfect match for lamb but loves all red meats.

Syrah (Shiraz)

Shiraz has been the vogue red variety for a while wooing wine drinkers with its rich sweet berry fruits and luscious texture. Australia’s recent export success has been largely due to this full bodied superstar and its ripe mulberry, plum, blackberry and spice flavors when grown in warmer areas like the Barossa and Clare Valleys and McLaren Vale. Cooler regions tend to show more spice and pepper as well as black fruits. Known as Syrah in France’s northern Rhone Valley, and indeed many other parts of the world, it produces more savory meaty styles here with Hermitage and Cornas being some of the countries most powerful and long lived reds. Any meat that has seen the char grill will work with Wagyu being the ultimate match.

Malbec

One of the traditional "Bordeaux varietals", Malbec has characteristics that fall somewhere between Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. A midseason ripened, it can bring very deep color, ample tannin, and a particular plum-like flavor component to add complexity to claret blends.

Outside Bordeaux it is known as Côt and, in Cahors, also as Auxerrois. There are in fact hundreds of local synonyms, since Malbec at one time was widely planted in nearly every area of France. Sensitivity to frost and proclivity to shatter or coulure are the primary reasons Malbec have become a decreasing factor in most of France. Although plantings in the Medoc have decreased by over two-thirds since the mid-twentieth century, Malbec is now the dominant red varietals in the Cahors area. The Appellation Controlée regulations for Cahors require a minimum content of 70%.

Sauternes from France cope with the richest of desserts but their best known match in culinary circles is foie gras. Styles utilising dried grapes such as Pantelleria can pair chocolate, while fresher fruitier styles like Rieslings or Muscats are better with fruit-based dishes.
